On the weekend of June 15, 2018, the PanHellenic Scholarship Foundation held its annual Alumni Weekend and Awards Ceremony & Gala. The PanHellenic broke a new record this year by awarding 45 talented Greek American undergraduates with a total of \$260,000 in scholarship awards.

Celebrations began on Friday, June 15 with an Alumni Weekend Welcome Reception at **Holland & Knight** courtesy of the Foundation's pro bono counsel, **Elias Matsakis** and co-sponsored by **College Year in Athens**. 2018 Recipients, PanHellenic Alumni, and other Greek American young professionals enjoyed food and drinks while admiring the beautiful Chicago skyline.

Saturday morning, 2018 Recipients, PanHellenic Alumni, and other young professionals met at the **Racquet Club of Chicago** for our 2nd Annual Mentorship Luncheon graciously hosted by **Nick Alexos** and sponsored by **The Hellenic Initiative**. 2018 PARADIGM HONOREE REINCE PRIEBUS



The PanHellenic Scholarship Foundation was proud to honor **Reince Priebus** as our 2018 Paradigm Award honoree. Mr. Priebus currently serves as President and Chief Strategist of Michael Best & Friedrich LLP. Most recently, he served as White House Chief of Staff, managing White House staff and collaborating with Members of Congress and other key policymakers.

Mr. Priebus was born in New Jersey to parents Dimitra Pitsiladis and Richard Priebus. His father served in the US Army in Ethiopia before meeting his mother in Sudan, where she worked at the American Embassy. Although Dimitra was born in Khartoum, Sudan, her family was originally from Mytilene, Lesbos. The Priebus family eventually moved to the Midwest, settling in Kenosha, Wisconsin.

Mr. Priebus volunteered for his first political campaign at the age of 16, before graduating from Tremper High School in Kenosha. He went on to attend the University of Wisconsin, Whitewater, graduating cum laude with a degree in English and Political Science before attending the University of Miami School of Law.

While attending law school, Mr. Priebus served as Clerk for the Wisconsin Court of Appeals, the Wisconsin Supreme Court, and the United States District Court for the Southern District of Florida. He also interned for the NAACP Legal Defense Fund in Los Angeles before graduating with a Juris Doctor with honors.

Mr. Priebus has a long history in politics as a grassroots volunteer, working his way up through the ranks of Wisconsin politics. In 2009, he served as general counsel to the Republican National Committee, before being elected to serve as Chairman in 2011. He oversaw a dramatic turnaround of the Committee—rescuing its finances, repairing its operations, and rebuilding its ground game. During Priebus' tenure, Republicans expanded their majorities in the House of Representatives, took back the Senate and ultimately, won the presidency in 2016. He left his role as one of the most successful chairmen of either political party in American history.

Mr. Priebus is a proud Greek American, supporting Hellenic issues and bringing them much-needed national attention. He has been a vocal supporter of US-Greece relations and a strong advocate of Hellenic values such as free speech, freedom of belief, and education. In 2011, Mr. Priebus became an Archon of the Ecumenical Patriarchate of Constantinople, Order of Saint Andrew the Apostle.

Mr. Priebus gave a passionate speech after the Awards Ceremony about how Hellenic values such as faith, family, and philotimo set Greek Americans apart and truly enhance the fabric of American society. He recalled his childhood and how his Hellenic upbringing truly propelled him in life. Mr. Priebus reminded us that even though our parents and grandparents came to this country with very little, they all came looking for the same set of freedoms that are entitled to all people. No matter what our differences are we are bound together by our love of freedom. At the end of his speech, Mr. Priebus reminded scholars that they must go forward through life in service of one another, to never let their talents go to waste, and as they continue on, their education will help them reach their highest goals and help advance society.

Consisting of PHSF scholars and inspired by the vision of the Foundation, the Alumni Board launched the #AlumniChallenge this past spring in an effort to encourage PHSF alumni, friends and family to donate and collectively support a \$10,000 scholarship. Through the #AlumniChallenge, we were able to raise close to \$7,000, and the PHSF matched the remaining funds to fulfill the scholarship. This year also represented a record number of PHSF alumni who attended the Gala.

The spirit of the PHSF Gala permeated the entire weekend, as we hosted the Alumni Weekend for a second year in a row. Past alumni and this year's recipients, who traveled from across the U.S., were welcomed with a networking event the evening prior to the Gala, graciously hosted by Elias Matsakis at Holland & Knight. The following morning scholarship recipients, alumni, and special guests enjoyed a networking brunch hosted by The Hellenic Initiative at the Racquet Club of Chicago. After the Gala, we hosted an after party in downtown Chicago, culminating the festivities.
