2017 PANHELLENIC GALA CONTINUES SUCCESS WITH A RECORD BREAKING TURNOUT

This year's annual Award Ceremony and Gala, held at the Hilton Chicago, broke all previous attendance records with over 570 guests who helped us celebrate forty-two of our very best Greek-American undergraduate scholars. These rising stars of our community received an impressive \$255,000 in scholarship awards in recognition of their outstanding academic achievements. The scholars, their parents, and guests enjoyed a beautiful evening that began with cocktails in the Hilton's Grand Ballroom, followed by the awards ceremony in the beautiful International Ballroom, and the evening ended with a wonderful dinner, great music, and Greek dancing.

The mission of the PanHellenic Scholarship Foundation is to promote education by providing scholarships and educational programs to Greek-American students who, guided by the values of their Hellenic upbringing, have the potential to become life-long significant achievers who contribute to society in meaningful ways. The core of our beloved founder's mission, the late Mr. Chris P. Tomaras, was to build a better America through Education and Hellenism. We are proud to announce that as of June 2017 we have laid one more brick in the building of a better America. To date, we have awarded \$2.75 million in scholarships to over 400 undergraduate students of Hellenic descent, making the Foundation one of the leading scholarship award institutions in the United States.

The awards ceremony opened with a joyful welcome and introduction by Mistress of Ceremonies, **Betty Cantrell**. Betty, former Miss America 2016, was born to a Greek family in Warner Robins, Georgia and named after her grandmother, Baciliki. After her introduction, **Yanni Valsamas**, Director on the Board of the PanHellenic, conducted

the Awards Ceremony along with Academic Committee Chairman, **Dr. Constantine Georgakis** and Board Chairman, **Robert A. Buhler**. Before the ceremony, Yanni Valsamas gave a touching tribute to Mr. Tomaras reminding us that it was through Mr. Tomaras' dedication to Hellenism and education that everyone was able to gather that evening to honor our best and brightest.

This year's recipients attend elite schools all across the nation such as Stanford, Duke, Purdue, the University of Illinois, the United States Naval Academy, Temple University, Princeton, University of Chicago, and New York University. Their academic disciplines are diverse with scholars majoring in engineering, biochemistry, journalism, physiology, English, education, art history, archaeology, business, mathematics, political science, music, and the arts.

Each year, the Foundation presents the **Paradigm Award** to a distinguished Greek-American. Since its inception, the Paradigm Award

Prior to dinner, Board Trustees **John Manos** and **Tom Sotos**, on behalf of the Foundation, honored the Alexopoulos family, for **Dr. George Alexopoulos’** many years of service as Academic Committee Chairman, and Yanni Valsamas for his years of service as the Executive Director of the PanHellenic. The Alexopoulos family and Mr. Valsamas

were presented a plaque as a token of the foundation’s appreciation and gratitude.

After the presentation, guests enjoyed a wonderful evening of dinner and dancing, and three individuals won the Grand Raffle cash prizes. Congratulations to Roula Alakiotou, who won the \$1,000 prize; Anastasia Velliotis, winner of the \$5,000 prize, and Maria Lampros, winner of the grand prize of \$10,000!

Chairman Robert A. Buhler, the Board of Directors, Academic Committee, and Board of Advisors once again congratulate the 2017 Scholarship Award Recipients, and express deep appreciation to the guests and donors who made this year’s Awards Ceremony and Gala a great success.

2017 PARADIGM HONOREE JOHN PAPPAJOHN

The Power of a Positive Mindset

The PanHellenic Scholarship Foundation was proud to honor renowned businessman and philanthropist, John Pappajohn as our 2017 Paradigm Honoree. Mr. Pappajohn’s life is a prime example of the importance of hard work, a good education, and following one’s dreams.

Mr. Pappajohn immigrated from Greece with his family when he was just nine months old, and he grew up in Mason City, Iowa. His father passed away when John was only sixteen. After high school, Mr. Pappajohn worked his way through college, and it took him six years to earn his undergraduate degree in business. He graduated from the University of Iowa in 1952.

After graduation, Mr. Pappajohn organized Equity Dynamics, Inc. and Pappajohn Capital Resources becoming one of the first venture capitalists. He has been involved in over one hundred start ups, over fifty IPOs and has served as Director in over forty public companies.

Together with his wife, Mary, they have donated over \$100 million to various philanthropic causes, especially focusing on the promotion of higher education. The Pappajohns have been integral to the support of business schools, entrepreneurial centers, universities, and scholarship funds across the state of Iowa. Not only is Mr. Pappajohn a dedicated supporter of education, but he is an outstanding example of someone who is devoted to the values and principles of Hellenism and Orthodoxy. Mr. Pappajohn is a member of Archbishop Iakovos’ Leadership 100, where he served on the Executive Committee from 2001-2004. He has donated to the construction of the Saint Nicholas National Shrine at the World Trade Center. Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew has honored Mr. Pappajohn appointing him an Archon of the Order of Saint Andrew.

After the 2017 PanHellenic Award Ceremony, Mr. Pappajohn delivered a powerful speech about his early life, education, and career. During his speech, Mr. Pappajohn emphasized that adversity is a blessing in disguise because it taught him how to make good choices. However, the most important thing, he stated, was a Positive Mental Attitude that helped propel him to success throughout his life. Mr. Pappajohn spoke in depth about how a person must be willing to “pay the price” to be successful, but in order to be successful a person needs to be a dreamer. At the end of his speech, Mr. Pappajohn challenged this year’s recipients to be generous philanthropists. He then gifted each recipient \$100, challenging them to give back to the PanHellenic Scholarship Foundation.

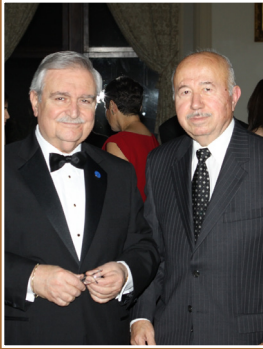
Dr. George Alexopoulos
