## PANHELLENIC SCHOLARSHIP FOUNDATION'S ANNUAL GALA GOES VIRTUAL: OVER 20,000 HAVE TUNED-IN TO CELEBRATE SCHOLARS SINCE JUNE

Chicago, IL – The COVID-19 pandemic did not prevent the PanHellenic Scholarship Foundation from awarding \$250,000 in total scholarships to 40 college students of Hellenic descent in 2020; this year the entire weekend of events was held virtually.

Established in 2002 by **Chris P. Tomaras**, the Foundation has provided over \$3.5 million to over 550 students since inception, and has held their Gala each June to celebrate and honor those awarded. Though many charities have canceled their galas and events, the PanHellenic Scholarship Foundation was determined to properly celebrate the achievements of the 2020 scholarship recipients.

The PanHellenic Alumni Weekend, June 12-13, 2020, began with a virtual **Welcome Reception** via Zoom for all scholars, sponsored by Elias N. Matsakis, Esq., the Foundation's pro bono legal counsel. The Welcome Reception was an opportunity for all Scholars to get to know one another ahead of the other weekend events, and included ice-breakers, break-out rooms, and warm welcomes by Mr. Matsakis, as well as the Foundation's three Trustees, Robert Buhler, John Manos, and Tom Sotos, who remembered the PanHellenic's Founder, and encouraged new recipients to stay involved as they grow and develop within their careers.

On Saturday morning, over 120 current and past scholarship recipients participated in a virtual zoom **Mentorship Luncheon**, held in partnership with The Hellenic Initiative and generously underwritten by Nicholas W. Alexos. This intimate setting (within separate breakout rooms) allowed scholars to receive career advice and guidance by 16 mentors who are leaders in their fields—stemming from business, law, medicine, finance, education, and more. Although recipients and mentors only shared a virtual afternoon, the goal is that these relationships continue year-round, with the majority exchanging information and keeping in touch following the annual event.

## **A MESSAGE FROM OUR CHAIRMAN**

Despite these difficult times, I am pleased to report that the PanHellenic Board of Directors unanimously voted to move forward with awarding \$250,000 in scholarships, as well as properly honoring our 2020 Scholars with a virtual PanHellenic Weekend which took place June 12 – 13, 2020.

By not having a traditional Gala, we were uncertain of how much of a financial burden the PanHellenic would incur. Additionally, like all other nonprofits in the industry, we did not know what a "Virtual" event would entail.

However, uncertainty never stopped our Founder, Chris P. Tomaras, and it was not going to stop our Board. Remarkably, our donors, and specifically our Scholarship Society 200, 100, and 50 members, unwaveringly contributed to our virtual weekend, very generously. Thank you; we are blessed.

I would also like to highlight the PanHellenic's continued efforts to provide our scholars value well "Beyond a Scholarship" – by continuing to develop our 3 key areas of focus:

1) Mentoring - We conducted our 4th Annual Mentorship Luncheon, co-hosted by The Hellenic Initiative, only virtually. Over 125 young Hellenes from the PanHellenic, THI and NHS were coached by a world-class group of 16 Mentors. Thank you to everyone involved.

2) Alumni Development - The PanHellenic Alumni hosted a virtual networking "mixer" for our new class of 2020 Scholars. Each of our new 40 Scholars spent time telling everyone about themselves, and were warmly welcomed by all PanHellenic constituents. This was just the beginning of each new Scholar's PanHellenic networking connection...a value for life.

**3) Internships** - Besides networking with Alumni and strong Mentors, we deeply believe our Scholars need great jobs, once out of school. Good internships help lead to good job offers. As such, last year we began our Internship Initiative, and had 15+ companies supporting our efforts with 1-3 internships available at each company. Though some internships remain, and some are already signed up, several had to furlough this effort, for now, but we will be geared up again for next Spring, 2021.

Speaking of next Spring, let me now formally invite all 2020 Scholars to join our future 2021 Scholars next year at our formal, in-person PanHellenic Weekend, taking place June 18-19, in Chicago, God willing.

Scholars, thank you also for being good sports and allowing us to "interview" you, and then surprise you with the news that you had won. We greatly look forward to meeting you in person next year.

I'd also like to recognize many who have worked on this program directly and have supported our efforts: an amazing Academic Committee, our Virtual Weekend Committee, consultants Tina Manikas, Lexi Chionis, Chris Greene and Fred Frederiksen, as well as PanHellenic Directors Peter Korbakes and Vivian Haritos, who were involved in every aspect of this event. Of course, a special thanks to all our Board of Directors and Advisory Board members, who not only smartly guide us, but who are also our global ambassadors, always passionately representing the PanHellenic.

Lastly, a thank you to over **20,000** people who have watched our Virtual Awards Gala since it streamed live on June 13—we are honored that you joined us and would be delighted to tell you more about our organization. We hope to see you next year in Chicago.

## FROM THE ALUMNI BOARD: GALA & ALUMNI WEEKEND COMMITTEE DELIVER A SPECIAL EXPERIENCE FOR 2020 RECIPIENTS

Upon the end of the Alumni Weekend in 2019, many of us recipients left feeling that this was only the beginning of our involvement with the PanHellenic Scholarship Foundation. The entire mission and spirit of that weekend showed us the meaning and purpose of this organization that is truly making an impact on the lives of Greek-American students across the nation. When we signed up for the Alumni Board, we never imagined how involved and impactful our role would be in making the weekend come to life. With the rise of the pandemic, our interactions took a new form, granted us new responsibilities, and brought us closer than we thought we could become across our screens.
