The Awards

Our Foundation's Scholarship Awards are offered to high school graduates who are prepared to continue their studies at a college or university, thus achieving a higher level of education that provides a platform for greater accomplishments in life.

It is our intent that several awards be offered annually ranging up to \$5,000 each, depending on the number of recipients, the level of contributions and the resulting size of our Scholarship Fund.

Each year, during the Fall, a social gathering is held, organized by the Foundation, for presenting the awards and honoring the recipients. The event is open to the general public and attended by the award recipients, their families and friends, our donors, Foundation officials and dignitaries from the U.S. and Greece.
