

Master of Ceremonies -Bill Kurtis

The PanHellenic Scholarship Foundation is honored to have Bill Kurtis as Emcee of this year's Awards Gala. An acclaimed documentary host and producer, network and major market news anchor, and multimedia production company president, Bill Kurtis recently celebrated his fortieth anniversary in the field of broadcasting. Born in Florida and raised in Independence, Kansas, Kurtis graduated from The University of Kansas with a Bachelor of Science degree in Journalism. He attended Washburn University School of Law where he was awarded a Juris Doctor degree.

Kurtis began his television career at WIBW-TV (CBS) in Topeka, Kansas. In 1966, Kurtis was hired by WBBM-TV in Chicago where he was a field reporter and later anchor of *The Channel Two News*. Kurtis moved on to the network level at CBS where he anchored the CBS Morning News and contributed to CBS Reports. Returning to Chicago and WBBM-TV as news anchor in 1985, Kurtis began his career as a documentarian, traveling to the far ends of the earth for the Peabody Award-winning series The New Explorers, which aired on A&E. In 1990, he founded Kurtis Productions and began producing programs including the long-running, award-winning Investigative Reports and Cold Case Files as well as Investigating History for The History Channel. Kurtis has also served as the host of A&E's *American Justice*—the longest running non-fiction justice series on cable. Kurtis is also an author. The Death Penalty on Trial: Crisis in American Justice (Public Affairs) is his most recent book, which explores issues surrounding capital punishment in America.

In his home state of Kansas, Kurtis is a rancher, radio station owner, art gallery owner, small businessman, supporter of small-town America, and an active conservationist. His 10,000-acre Red Buffalo Ranch is a working cattle ranch, raising and marketing organic grass-fed beef. Mr. Kurtis is the recipient of numerous humanitarian, journalism, and broadcasting awards including Emmys, CableACE Awards, and the Thurgood Marshall Award for his *Investigative Reports* installment on the death penalty.

A longtime philhellene, Kurtis had also served as master of ceremonies at the "Banquet for the Faithful" during Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew's 1997 visit to Chicago.


Musical Interlude



JOHN P. CALAMOS, SR.

John P. Calamos, Sr., is chairman, chief executive officer and chief investment officer of the firm he founded in 1977, which he took public as Calamos Asset Management in 2004. A pioneer in investment strategies and techniques to help manage risk, Mr. Calamos has created a reputation for using investment techniques to control risk, preserve capital and build wealth for clients over the long term.

From its origins as an institutional convertible bond manager, Calamos Investments has grown into a diversified asset management firm with major institutional and individual clients in the U.S. and around the world. Mr. Calamos received his undergraduate degree in Economics and M.B.A. in Finance from the Illinois Institute of Technology. Joining the United States Air Force after graduation, he served as a combat pilot during the Vietnam War and ultimately earned the rank of Major.

It was during his time in the Air Force that Mr. Calamos became intrigued by the risk management aspects of convertible bonds. By applying option price theory to the valuation of convertibles he was able to demonstrate the benefit of convertibles as part of an of investment strategy and began to attract institutional investors who remain clients today.

Mr. Calamos won the Ernst & Young Entrepreneur Of The Year® award for the financial services sector, Lake Michigan Area program for 2006. He is a member of the Investment Analysts Society of Chicago.

A frequent speaker at investment seminars and conferences, he has taught graduate level courses on finance and investments and is often quoted as an authority on risk-managed investment strategies in *Barron's*, *Fortune*, *Forbes*, *Pensions & Investments*, *Financial World*, *Nation's Business*, *The Wall Street Journal* and on *CNBC* and *Bloomberg Forum*.

Mr. Calamos has written two books: *Investing in Convertible Securities: Your Complete Guide to the Risks and Rewards*, and *Convertible Securities: the Latest Instruments, Portfolio Strategies, and Valuation Analysis*.

The author of a chapter on convertibles for the Pension Investment Handbook by Ibbotson Associates, he has also written articles for publications such as Personal Financial Planning, Pension World, Pensions & Investments, Journal of Investing and Financial Executive. Mr. Calamos' latest press interviews include appearances on *Kudlow & Company, Bloomberg's Market Week, Open Exchange with Suzy Asaad, CNNfn's Halftime Report,* and *Nightly Business Report.*

The son of Greek immigrants, John Calamos often expresses pride in his Greek heritage and the work ethic that he learned growing up in his family grocery store in Chicago. He learned first-hand from his parents that if he takes care of his customers, his business will prosper. In honor of his parents, he has made many contributions to various Greek American community endeavors, including a major gift to the Hellenic Museum and Cultural Center in Chicago.

Our Directors and Administration

The PanHellenic Scholarship Foundation is an Illinois non-profit corporation with an IRS designation of 501(c)(3). It is administered by a Board of Directors and an Executive Committee (Officers). A separate Advisory Board representing various disciplines provides guidance and support.

Selection of Award recipients is made by an Academic Committee appointed by the Board of Directors. This Committee works independently and makes its decisions based on the established criteria. Members of the Board of Directors, Officers, the Advisory Board and employees of the Foundation may not serve on the Academic Committee.



The Awards

Our Foundation's Scholarship Awards are offered to high school graduates who are prepared to continue their studies at a college or university. In doing so we provide an opportunity to achieve a higher level of education that provides a platform for greater accomplishments in life. The Foundation also considers applicants among students already attending a university or college.

It is our intent that several Awards be offered annually, ranging up to \$10,000 each, depending on the number of recipients, the level of contributions and the resulting size of our Scholarship Fund in any given year.

Each year during the Fall, a social gathering is held, organized by the Foundation, for presenting the Awards and honoring the recipients. The event is open to the general public and attended by the Award recipients, their families and friends, our donors, Foundation officials and dignitaries from the U.S. and Greece.
